Maps

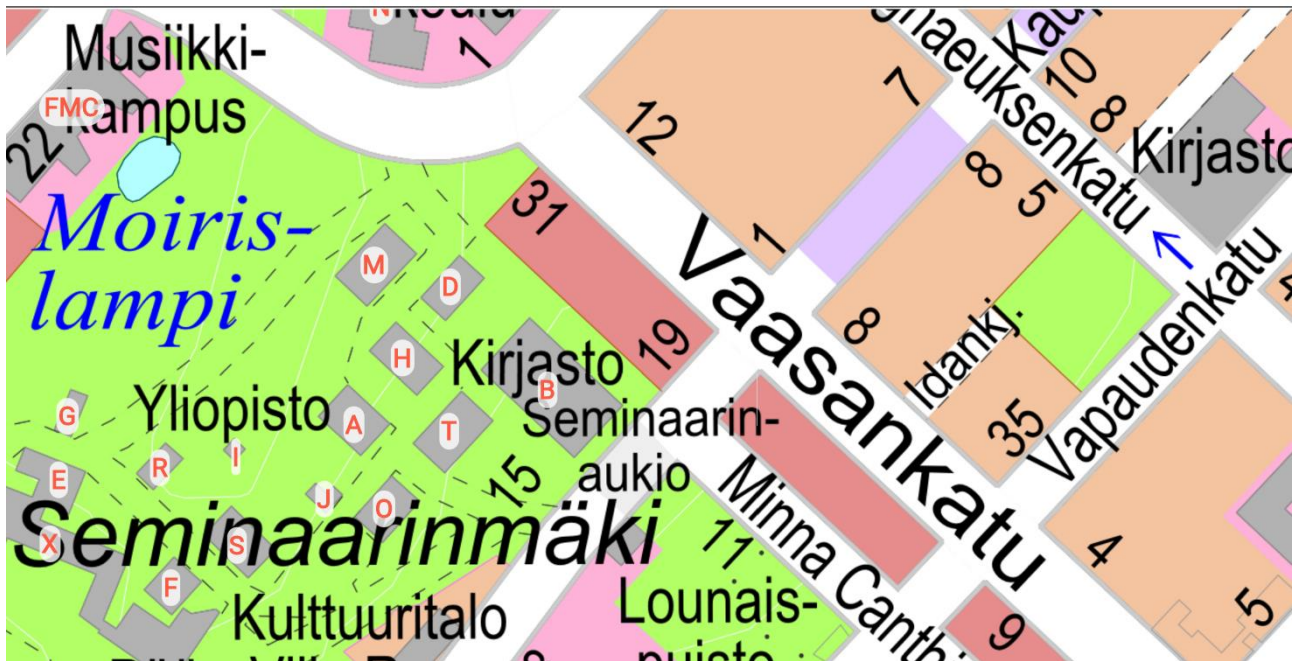

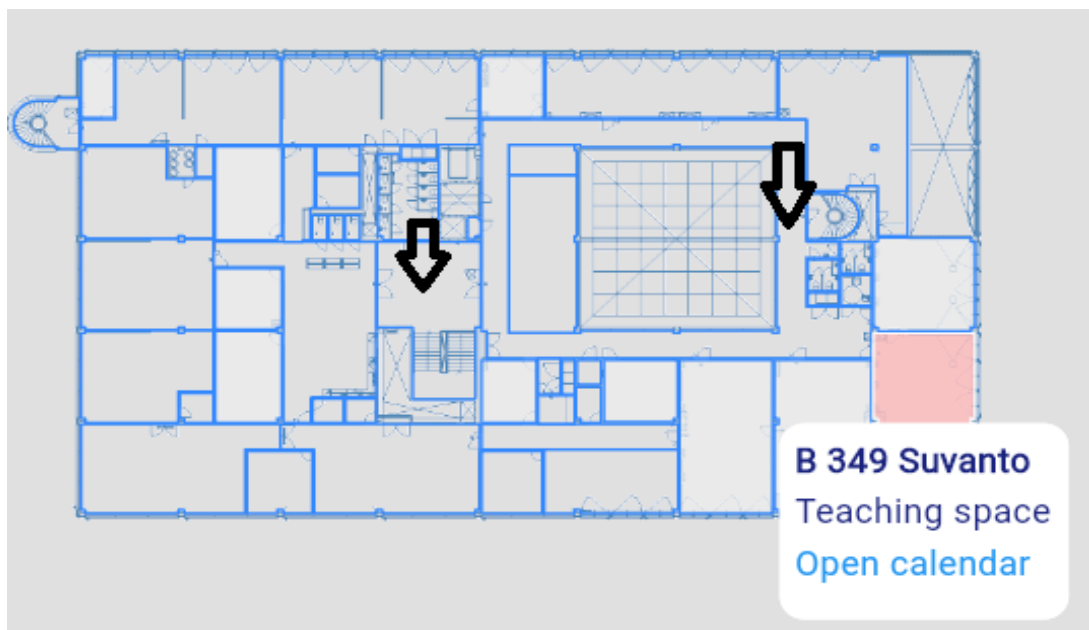
Black circle = university area where the symposium will be held.
